Dear Honourable Director General and Senior Conservation Officer,

We, the undersigned, express our serious concerns about the plans to include inhumane elephant activities, such as elephant polo, elephant football and elephant racing, during the Chitwan Elephant and Tourism festival in Sauraha, Chitwan. Elephant polo and football requires elephants to have been trained cruelly, exposes them to risks of injuries and maltreatment during the tournament, and reinforces an outdated view that it is okay to use these endangered wild animals for entertainment.

We call on the Department of National Park and Wildlife Conservation (DNPWC) to prevent the participation of government-owned elephants at the tournament, encourage private owners to recall the participation of their elephants, and that DNPWC and private owners draft policies that will prohibit such practices in the future.

At a press conference in Kathmandu, the festival organizing committee noted that 80 government and private owned elephants will participate in the 18th Chitwan Elephant and Tourism Festival to be held in Sauraha, Chitwan from December 26th to December 30th.

Asian elephants (Elephas maximus) are considered endangered by the IUCN (International Union for Conservation of Nature) and their wild population trend is decreasing. A significant number of Asian elephants are maintained in captivity by most range states, Nepal included. Nepal's government-owned elephants are primarily used for patrolling the national parks and thus contribute to the preservation of natural habitat. In contrast, the privately owned elephants are commonly engaged in tourism activities, such as elephant-back safaris.

Over the past decades, a mindset shift has taken place in tourists and travel companies, recognizing that elephant riding, elephant performances and direct interactions between visitors and elephants are unacceptable. These activities rely on cruel training, separation of



calves from their mothers, restraint through chains or small enclosures, poor nutrition, inadequate veterinary care and punishment based daily management. Many travel companies instead seek elephant-friendly attractions, such as observing elephants in their natural habitat – either in the wild or in sanctuaries or similar progressive captive facilities that ensure best possible captive welfare, while preventing the breeding of a new generation of elephants.

The planned integration of elephant polo and football activities during the upcoming Chitwan Elephant and Tourism festival will likely be perceived by many global leaders in the travel industry and travellers to Nepal as a step back, significantly reducing Nepal's attractiveness as a tourist destination.

With this letter we, the undersigned, call on the DNPWC to take the opportunity to mitigate this event's negative impact on Nepal's elephants and its international reputation by:

- 1. Issuing an order for government-owned elephants to not participate in the festival
- 2. Encouraging the festival organizing committee to remove all elephant performance related activities
- 3. Developing policies or regulations that prohibit or phase out the use of elephants for entertainment in future festivals and other tourism activities.
